ONSITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM PERMIT APPLICATION PROCEDURES

1. Onsite wastewater treatment system installers must be registered with both the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services and the Stone County Health Department; a list of registered installers can be provided.
2. All areas of the permit application must be completed; the installer must complete Section 13, Site Layout.
3. A soil scientist registered with the Stone County Health Department must complete a soil morphology report; a list of registered soil scientist can be provided.
4. Setback distances must meet the minimum standards according to 19 CSR 20- 3.060(1)(D); a document for these requirements can be provided.
5. The Stone County Health Department Environmental Public Health Specialist will schedule a pre-site visit. The installer, and/or property owner can be present if they so desire, but it is not required.
6. The installer must stake out the proposed system on the property before the pre-site visit is made.
7. The pre-site report may indicate that the property is unsuitable for a conventional wastewater system, if so an advanced system may be required.
8. When the system is approved and a permit has been issued, the permit **MUST** be **POSTED** on the property in a visible location.
9. The installer **MUST** call the Environmental Public Health Specialist to either schedule a final inspection, or receive verbal approval to complete a Certification of System Without Onsite Inspection form, prior to covering the system
